THE POWYS FAMILY

The Powys family is unique in the arts. Of eleven children, ten attained adulthood. Of these ten, eight were professionally connected with the arts. The youngest brother, William is a gifted amateur artist.

The three older brothers, John, Llewelyn and Theodore are widely known for their writings. Gertrude was an artist. (Her portrait of John hangs in the National Museum of Wales at Cardiff.) Littleton used his retired years to write of his times as headmaster at Sherburne School. Albert Reginald was an architect. Two of the five books he wrote, *The English Parish Church* and *Repair of Ancient Buildings* are considered basic in the field. Philippa was a poet, and Marian an authority on lace.

Nineteen hundred and seventy-two is the centennial year of the birth of John Cowper Powys. The Colgate University Library collection started with the gift from Norman Strouse of several manuscripts and letters by John. Since the initial gifts we have extended and added to the materials by and about the older brother. An advantageous acquisition that included materials by Llewelyn and Theodore prompted an expansion of the collection to include all the members of the family and some of their friends.

This checklist is a record of items by and about members of the Powys family in the Colgate University Library Collection. It is divided into five sections:

Within each section the manuscripts are listed first, followed by letters and then publications in chronological order. Following the first publication of a book title, all subsequent editions are entered.

The collection has served and is continuing to serve as a source for literary investigation. It is the compiler's hope that wider use will be afforded by the publication of this checklist.
