Important Information from Dr. Lukacher

Earlier this year we had every expectation that Dr. Ned Lukacher of the University of Illinois would be speaking to us at the Exeter Conference but unfortunately he is, for various reasons, now unable to do so. He expresses his great disappointment and sends us his "best wishes for a wonderful meeting." He also writes as follows:

"My chief reason for wanting to attend this year's meeting was to meet several of the contributors to a collection of essays on JCP that I am editing with Denis Lane. I have arranged this collection which is contracted for publication with the Duke University Press, Durham, North Carolina, USA. If our contributors submit their essays on time, i.e., September 1984, we shall have a book by 1985.
......The Duke University Press has agreed at my urging to make copies of the collection available to the Society at a discount. You will be hearing further from me on this matter into the Fall. Among the English contributors will be Glen Cavaliero, Timothy Hyman, John Hodgson, Carol Coates, and Belinda Humfrey. On the American side there will be essays by Denis and me, along with Ben Jones, Tom Southwick, Richard Maxwell, Ian Duncan and Anthony Low. And to cap it all, G.Wilson Knight has just given us an original essay on JCP and spiritualism."

And that last sentence of Ned Lukacher reminds us sharply what a grand and ageless character we have in our President. His latest literary activity - apart from that mentioned above - is the publication of one of his early novels, Klinton Top, which was written in 1927 but has not yet appeared in print. The story centres round a hero for whom disaster in boyhood brought on acute mental suffering. His troubles are assuaged by love, the heroine pitting her strength against nature powers which function here as an agent in the drama. The solution approaches tragedy but ends with a strange yet positive conclusion, a higher state being adumbrated.

Klinton Top is published by The Redcliffe Press, Bristol, at £3.50 which represents unusually good value. Professor Wilson Knight will bring several copies with him which he will be happy to autograph for purchasers if desired.
